- I. Moses' intervention and further delay
 - a. Moses was acting in obedience to his divine vocation when he killed the Egyptian, Acts 7:25.
 - b. V 11 "his own people" (lit. his brothers).
 - c. This intervention resulted in further delay.
 - d. Moses left himself to option but to flee to the wilderness.
 - e. V 16-17 Moses again inserts himself into another situation, water rights.
 - f. This flight though showed Moses that the Lord still loved and cared for him. Although he had messed things up, in his new home he found a family, safety and a home.
 - g. He decided to stay there and was changed. His feelings though are reflected in the naming of his son. 1 Ki 19:3-8. He came to the end of himself!
 - h. The only way forward is to "mobilize God on our side".:
